



OUTSOURCING AGREEMENT

FOR COLLECTION AND TREATMENT OF COVID -19 BMW.

This Outsourcing Agreement made at Hoshiarpur, on 01st September 2020 Between;

M/s Bio Medical Waste Treatment Plant Pvt. Ltd. Vill. Pangoli, Defence Road, Tehsil & Distt. Pathankot-Punjab (as FIRST PARTY) And

Ivy Healthcare Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd. (Ivy Hospital,

Hoshiarpur)

(as SECOND PARTY).

BEDS - 15

Whereas as per "Guidelines for Handling, Treatment, and Disposal of Waste Generated during Treatment / Diagnosis / Quarantine of COVID-19 Patients (Revision 1)" dated 25th of March 2020 issued by CPCB Delhi and applicable throughout the country, the Urban Local Body (ULB)/Authority responsible for operating the quarantine center of a particular area is to ensure safe collection and disposal of any waste generated from Quarantine Camps / Homes and Home Care Clinics having COVID-19 patients or suspects. Refer para (f) "DUTIES OF URBAN LOCAL BODIES" of the said Guidelines. Similarly the CBMWTFs role and responsibilities has also been mentioned in para (d) of the Guidelines.

Now FIRST PARTY, being a CBWTF authorized by State Pollution Control Board for treatment and disposal of Bio Medical waste for Pathankot District SECOND PARTY being the ULB having certain locations within its jurisdiction generating COVID-19 Waste; so the SECOND PARTY having approached the FIRST PARTY to outsource collection from a single point and then transport, treat and dispose of the COVID-19 waste generated in area under its jurisdiction; and both parties now agree to work together as per following terms and conditions:

1. That the FIRST PARTY shall inform regarding all Camps, Homes having suspected COVID-19 patients to the local administration and SPCB from time to time with copy to second party
2. Similarly the FIRST PARTY shall also carry out and shall be responsible for procedures and operations as attributed to it in the Guidelines.
3. DEFINITION OF BIO MEDICAL WASTE.
Bio Medical Waste shall comprise of used syringes, date expired or discarded medicines, used masks / gloves, drain bags, urine bags (after draining of urine), body fluids or blood soaked tissues / cotton, empty ampoules etc and other such waste generated from house of COVID-19 cases.

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4. COMA

4. COMMON WASTE DEPOSITION CENTRES.

SECOND PARTY shall create a Common Waste Deposition Centre in its area and identify this to the FIRST PARTY. All door step BMW collected by the SECOND PARTY in **yellow bags provided by the FIRST PARTY** shall be done by local waste collector agency of the area and stored in Deposition Centre/designated and then lifted by the FIRST PARTY from here.

It shall be the responsibility of the SECOND PARTY that the Deposition Centers and areas around is kept properly disinfected suggest disinfectants multiple times day . The area around the store should be kept dry and be accessible to FIRST PARTY's collection vehicles which can be a mid-sized truck.

5. GENERAL WASTE V/S BIO MEDICAL WASTE.

- (i) All General waste should not be mixed with BMW and shall be treated as per MSW Rules 2016.
- (ii) Both parties understand the CBWTFs across the country have been designed and planned to treat Bio Medical Waste quantity generated in normal times and also the cost of treatment is high. Transportation infrastructure of CBWTFs in also not expandable beyond a limit; so it becomes pertinent for the SECOND PARTY to limit the quantity of Bio Medical Waste in order to avoid a catastrophe in case of a capacity explosion.
- (iii) Quantity of Bio Medical Waste can be limited by not mixing or contaminating normal solid waste with infected waste. Certain good practices like unpacking consumables and food articles before taking inside isolation/quarantine wards can be practiced.

6. QUARANTINE CAMPS COLLECTION.

That the SECOND PARTY shall inform the FIRST PARTY regarding Quarantine Camps set up in its jurisdiction area and Bio Medical Waste from these camps shall be lifted by the CBWTF on call basis. A period of at least 24 hours shall be given to lift the waste.

QUARANTINE HOMES / HOME CARE COLLECTION.

- i) That door step collection of Bio Medical Waste from these centers shall be done by the SECOND PARTY through its local Solid Waste collector in separate dedicated vehicles / carriages and stored in identified Common Waste Deposition Centers/Designated common collection points for subsequent lifting by first party. First party shall lift BMW from designated CCP only.

The FIRST PARTY shall lift waste from these Deposition Centers.

The SECOND PARTY shall inform the FIRST PARTY at the end of each day quantity of waste (in bags as well as weight) stored at the Deposition Centers so that FIRST PARTY can make adequate transport arrangements in advance.



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- (iv) SECOND PARTY shall ensure that all bags used to collect waste are doubled, well tied with cable tie. Min 50 micron thick bags, yellow in color, non-chlorinated plastic, as specified in Bio Medical Waste Rules 2016 and labeled with COVID 19 Waste Sticker. Non-conforming bags or BMW not packed and sealed as per CPCB guidelines can be refused by the FIRST PARTY and reported to SPCB.
- (v) The SECOND PARTY shall provide to the representative of the FIRST PARTY coming to collect waste details of number of bags and weight of waste given. The FIRST PARTY representative shall verify the same while collecting and a slip shall be made and signed by both parties.

8. COSTS & PAYMENTS.

The cost to be paid by the SECOND PARTY to the FIRST PARTY for collection & treatment of waste shall be:

- (i) (A) _____ 15,000/- (15 beds) per month.
OR
(B) _____ or 750/visit (15 beds) no of visits
450kg (15 beds)
- (!!) Rs.30/- Per kg for waste lifted and treated in excess of _____ per month in addition to above charges mentioned (i).
- (!!!) Non-chlorinated Yellow bags size and Rates.

Size 26" X 32" = Rs.255/-per kgs +@18% GST
Size 30" X 40" =Rs. 255/-per kgs+ @18%GST

- (IV) GST shall be extra as applicable.
- (V) Payment equivalent to minimum one month advance and subsequent payments shall be released by second party within 10 days after submission of bills.

This agreement is being signed to handle and manage Bio-Medical Waste generated during Corona pandemic This shall be valid till the non expandable existing infrastructure/resources of CBMWTF is not exhausted. As such CBWTF is not bound to lift/treat the BMW In case of any such emergency situation beyond the control of the CBMWTF.
