

29 The HCF shall ensure occupational safety of all its health care workers and others involved in handling of bio-medical waste by providing appropriate and adequate personal protective equipments.

30 The occupier of the HCF or an operator of a common bio-medical waste treatment facility shall be liable for all the damages caused to the environment or the public due to improper handling of bio-medical wastes. The occupier or operator of common bio-medical waste treatment facility shall be liable for action under section 2 and section 15 of the Act, in case of any violation.

31 The HCF shall adopt the following treatment and disposal methods as described in the BMW Management Rules, 2016

- i. Chemical treatment using at least 1% to 2% Sodium Hypochlorite having 30% residual chlorine for twenty minutes or any other equivalent chemical reagent and should demonstrate Log 104 reduction efficiency for microorganisms as given in Schedule III.
- ii. Mutilation or shredding must be to an extent to prevent unauthorized reuse.
