

DEPUTE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH SERVICES SIVAGANGA. 2. Whereas Primary Health Centres. Comes Under The Deputy Director of Health Services. SIVAGANGAI DISTRICTS (List of Hospitals under the jurisdiction of Party B) are generating Bio Medical Waste which need to be managed in accordance with the Bio Medical Waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 2016 of Govt. of India.

Terms and Conditions:

- 1. Whereas (Party A) offers to provide the services required for Collection, Transportation of all Biomedical Waste (including empty plastic saline bottles, pouches and plastic cans from the hospitals) which are primarily collected from all the source points within the hospitals and stored in a common storage room by the concerned hospital and its final disposal at the Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility as per Biomedical Waste (Handling and Management) Rules, 2016, to be complied by Party B with the above said rules on a "user - per - principle" as per Annexure - I
- 2. The above rate (Annexure I) is inclusive of all costs towards collection, transportation, treatment and end disposal of biomedical waste from the Government hospitals as per the Bio Medical Wastes (Management and Handling) Rules, 2016 of Govt. of India, on Daily Basis Or Once in 48 Hour basis (as quoted by Party A and agreed by the authority for periodicity of collection) inclusive of all statutory taxes. [Currently GST is not applicable]
- 3. The empty plastic saline bottles, pouches and plastic cans collected along with the biomedical waste from the hospitals should be weighed in kilograms in different type of categories as mentioned in the bidding document and should be recorded in the register available in the hospital and a receipt in triplicate on number of kilograms and category of empty plastic saline bottles, pouches and plastic cans lifted on that particular day from that particular hospital should be handed over to MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A) by the nodal person designated for Implementation of Infection control and Biomedical waste Management. However for payment purpose, the weight of empty saline bottles, plastic pouches and cans will be excluded from the monthly billing and other RED category wastes said to be infectious waste, weighed in kilograms, based on the receipts issued by CTF shall be included in the monthly payment for collection, transportation, treatment and final disposal of Bio Medical Waste by the CTF every month.

4 .If the collected bio medical waste including empty plastic saline bottles, pouches and plastic cans from the hospitals are not lifted as mentioned above by MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A), then the payment to the service provider,

11. The list of Government hospitals and the periodicity of collection of biomedical waste from the hospitals in each district is given in **Annexure** III.

BMW - CTF - Terms and Conditions:

- The price indicated is firm and includes all cost towards manpower, resource requirement like all equipment's, consumable, management / monitoring services and resource requirement for administration etc., as per the terms and conditions of the bidding document and any other taxes and duties, royalties as applicable.
- 2. The 12% GST charges implemented from 18th Jul-2022, onwards, it will be subject to change as per government notifications from time to time.
- (a) The cost offered by the CTF for collection of only empty plastic saline bottles, pouches and cans will be cleared by CTF at free of cost and shall be excluded from the monthly billing.
 - (b) Other RED category wastes said to be infectious waste, weighed in kilograms, based on the receipts issued by CTF shall be included in the monthly payment for collection, Transportation and final disposal of Bio Medical Waste by the CTF every month.
- Number of hospitals shall vary from time to time. But the rate shall not exceed the above rate till the contract period.
- PERIOD OF CONTRACT: The contract period will be for THREE YEARS from the date of letter of intent received.

Role and Responsibilities of MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A)

1. Prior planning of the coverage area and its operation with neat timings should be informed to the head of the Government Hospitals listed in annexure 1 of this

(The Deputy Director/ BMO / Dean / Medical Superintendent, Hospital superintendent / Chief Medical Officer / In-Charge Medical Officer / Regional Administrative Medical Officers, whoever the case may be).

2. Any change in the plan should be intimated well in advance to the head of the Government Hospital (Dean / Medical Superintendent, Hospital superintendent / Chief Medical Officer / In-Charge Medical Officer / Regional Administrative Medical Officers, whoever the case may be).

(Party A) is responsible for the safe transportation of the Bio Medical Waste from the hospital premises to the Common Treatment Facility as per the norms prescribed by TNPCB. MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A) will arrange alternate vehicle during the period of vehicle breakdown for the transportation.

4.MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS(Party A) should keep proper records for the quantity of Bio Medical Waste lifted under different categories from hospital on 48 HOURS basis in Thanjavur, SIVAGANGAI DISTRICTS, Tiruvarur, Sivagangai Districts, Mayiladuthurai, Pudukottai, Sivagangai & Ariyalur districts.

5. The quantity (weight) of Bio medical Waste lifted from each hospital should be entered in a register maintained in that particular hospital and should be endorsed by the concerned hospital authority who has been designated for this work.

6.MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A) is responsible for following statutory rules and regulations prescribed by Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board prevailing on the day for the service and for keeping and producing all the records required on this regard by the authorities.

7. MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A) will make periodic inspections of the SIVAGANGAI DISTRICTS, district Primary Health Centres (List of hospital under the jurisdiction of Party B)regarding collection and segregation of Bio - Medical Waste (Management and Handling) Rules 2016 of Govt. of India.

8.MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A) shall provide the training once in three months free of cost about segregation of bio medical waste as per color coding of the present BMW (M) rules 2016, collection of waste in colour coded bags as well as occupational safety in management and Handling of Bio Medical Wastes.

9. MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A) shall send the bill in full and complete shape for the preceding month, by the 5th of the next month and the same shall be paid by Primary Health Centres. Comes, under The Deputy Director of Health Services. SIVAGANGAI DISTRICTS (under the Jurisdiction of Party B) through DD or Cheque drawn in favor of MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A) payable at THANJAVUR within 21 working days from the date of submission.



DEPUTE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH SERVICES SIVAGANGA. The Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility by, Whereas Primary Health Centres. comes Under The Deputy Director of Health Services. SIVAGANGAI DISTRICTS (under the jurisdiction of Party B) will be paid at the rate of 1/nth of the total biomedical waste collected on that particular day of the visit of service provider, total biomedical Waste Treatment Facility, where "n" is the day of visit of the service provider.

5. If the payment against the submitted bills (which are submitted in full and complete shape) is delayed beyond 21 working days from the date of submission, an interest @ 6% may be paid to service provider, the Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facility by Primary Health Centres, comes under The Deputy Director of Health Services, SIVAGANGAI DISTRICTS (under the jurisdiction of Party B).

6. Complaints (if any) shall be attended to in the shortest possible time, (48hrs) by the service provider under the jurisdiction of MEDICARE ENVIRO SYSTEMS (Party A) and the client under the jurisdiction of Primary Health Centres. comes under The Deputy Director of Health Services. SIVAGANGAI DISTRICTS (Party B) (Authorized signatory of the agreement).

Under the jurisdiction of (Party B) has the right to enter the operational premises of service provider, under the jurisdiction of Primary Health Centres. Agreement can be terminated by giving one month notice by both the parties, client and service provider.
